# SWANSEA AREA RATEPAYERS'ASSOCIATION MINUTES FOR MEETING OF November 16, 2010

- 1. CALL TO ORDER and DECLARATION OF CONFLICTS OF INTEREST: Nick Singh called the meeting to order at 7:35.
- 2. **AGENDA AMENDMENTS and APPROVAL:** There was no agenda available. It was decided that we would use the October 13<sup>th</sup> agenda and modify it appropriately.
- 3. MINUTES AMENDMENTS and APPROVAL (of October 13, 2010, May 18, 2010 and June 15, 2010): Many people did not received the latest revision of the October 13, 2010 minutes. David Fleming will send the latest version (v4) out for review. Approval will be deferred to the December Executive meeting.

## 4. **EXECUTIVE REPORTS**:

- a. **Membership:** No report as John Meijer sent his regrets.
- b. **Fundraising:** Tickets to the fall play Laura by Vera Caspary and George Sklar on November 18, 2010 are available from Louis Gris.
- c. <u>Treasurer's:</u> Kate Lawson read the report and motioned that it be accepted. The motion was seconded by Ian McIsaac and carried.
- d. **Expenses:** Kate Lawson submitted \$156.28 of SARA invoices for mailbox rental, coffee at all candidates meetings, and photocopies. David Fleming motioned that the expenses be paid. The motion was seconded by Elizabeth Elson and carried.

## 5. CURRENT MATTERS:

a. New Members and Guests for 45 Morningside Ave and 60 Beresford Ave: David Fleming motioned that the Executive deal with 45 Morningside Avenue at this point. The motion was seconded by Kate Lawson and carried. In attendance were, Tony De Cicco, Dino Giuliani and Lucia Favret from 47 Morningside Ave, Ruby and Gail Chalmers from 40 Morningside Ave, and Bill Zock, Roberto Salmena (Terra Firma Homes), and Sam Grasso (Terra Firma Homes) from 45 Morningside Ave were in attendance. Nick introduced the item and introduced Roberto Salmena to present his application stating that Terra Firma has been working in Swansea for 12 years to buy and improving properties by developing them. They want to improve the neighbourhood and not build houses that stick out; 45 Morningside is an opportunity for them to do just that. The stated that most of the variances were triggered by the introduction o the new zoning by-law. Lucia Favret was concerned about a number of items, primariy that the development was too big for the lot, and that all of the variances constituted a large not minor change. She was also rushed for time due to the short notice and no information, other than what is in the application, so needs more time to evaluate the application. Questions were asked about the whether the basement would be used for an apartment, and why there was a large open void at the front between over the living room. Sam Grasso replied that there are no window in the basement, and an apartment in not in their plans, the the large area is to make a higher more open space at the front, and that they would comply with the landscaping requirements, thus eliminating that variance. When it was pointed out that there are basement windows and that the variances were in fact valid, Sam Grasso retracted his statements. Some more questions were asked and answered, and the guests left so that the Executive could discuss the matter.

Bill Roberts motioned that SARA/SARF opposed the application on it merits. The motion was seconded by Late Lawson and carried. David Fleming motioned that Bill pen the letter in his legal capacity opposing the application. The motion was seconded by Kate Lawson and carried. David Fleming motioned that Louis Gris attend the COA meeting to represent SARA/SARG. The motion was seconded by Kate and carried.

60 Beresford Ave: David Fleming described the COA application at 60 Beresford Avenue where they are asking .88 GFA and a third floor addition. Bill Roberts motioned that SARA/SARA oppose the application and that David Fleming write a letter of opposition. The motion was seconded by Kate Lawson and carried.

It will give us to enough information to make a decision whether to proceed with the OMB appeal. Compounding matters is a technical problem with the original appeal that may make it problematic to continue.

- 1. All Candidates Meetings Toronto Municipal Election: Both the Councillor and the Mayoral All Candidates Meetings were well attended and went smoothly. The mayoral ACM was attended by the top four candidates, Rob Ford, Joe Pantalone, Rocco Rossi and George Smitherman. Ed Gaigalas will pencil in some dates for next years Provincial Election All Candidates meeting. When the date is known, he will let the incumbent, Cheri DiNovo know.
- m. <u>Ukrainian Festival and Bloor Street closures:</u> Lane closures between Jane and the South Kingsway create unnecessary traffic problems with the current incarnation. SARA should write a letter outlining concerns. Defer to January.
- n. <u>Southport Plaza:</u> Ian McIsaac reported he has raised \$3000, \$1500 from his condo and \$1500 from Ron Braun at RARG. Ron Braun will approach his condo's board and Ian will approach other condo's in the neighbourhood. Ron Braun has suggested that they team up with the developer to combine monies to hire a planner and get a joint study. Ian has started looking at planners, one being John Winter.
